The Corbiere Cobble PT 15km Walk 9 Trail rating 2



An interesting walk around the south east corner of Jersey starting at the famous Corbiere lighthouse, around the rugged coast and on to the lively village of St Aubins. The return is easier along the disused railway track

Enter the car park by the post box next to the Corbiere Phare hotel. Follow the cliff path sign and take the steps down into the old quarry and up the other side. You will pass a small granite stone building on the right. Keep to the path on the coast. Follow the path down alongside the railway line. You are now passing the local desalination plant, which is used to top up supplies during dry summers. Turn right towards coast at the next footpath sign, then left up steps. Follow the footpath behind some houses passing a “giant golfball on a stick”. Follow path going inland and soon you will come to the edge of the local prison, turn right at cliffpath sign and take left hand road past prison. (always heading towards coast) Follow tarmac road passing a house with gates.

Q What is the name of this house?

A.

By this house you can rejoin the path to Les Creux. Follow coastal path, and at next cliffpath sign you go down a lot of steps. Soon you will be able to see Beauport Bay below.

Q. What is written on the tall granite for Les Creux

A.

. From the car park follow the footpath sign to St Brelades Church. Soon St Brelades Bay comes into view and you will pass Fisherman’s Chapel

(well worth a visit).

There are toilets and refreshments in the bay. From here you will be able to see right around to Ouaisne Bay. At low tide you will be able to walk on the beach towards Ouaisne, but if the tide is high you will have to walk on the promenade.

Promenade walk to Ouaisne. Climb the steps at the end of the promenade and follow the path past 3 benches and soon Ouaisne bay comes into view. There are great views from this high point. At the end of the beach you will arrive at the Smugglers Inn, with toilets and a phone box.

Climb the road past the Smugglers Inn, and turn right at the top of the hill and take the gravel path on left towards Old Portelet Inn. Follow the road with the white line. Old Portelet Inn very nice for food and refreshments and lovely views of Portelet Bay and Janvrin’s Tomb on the island in the middle. Take

the path on the right out of the car park, and continue straight along the coastal path. Soon you will arrive at the small road to Noirmont Point. Here you can see the large gun emplacements with magnificent views from the point.

Question: On the gun emplacement on the left of the car park what is written on the top of the green sign?

Answer:

From here keep to the coastal path, and soon you will see St Aubin's Fort to your right. Keep following the path alongside the green fence and you eventually arrive back at the main road. Turn right along Route de Noirmont, and after 100m turn right into green lane, Route de Haut. The road starts to descend, this is Ghost hill and soon you will arrive in the lovely harbour and village of St Aubin's.

Here there are plenty of places to eat, there are public toilets on the opposite side of the harbour not far from the shops, by the sea wall.

Return Journey.

The railway walk starts near the Nat West bank behind some shops and restaurants. This is a very gentle walk of approx 6km all the way to Corbiere. You will cross over some roads, and you will pass Les Quennevais Sports Centre on your right, past a large green building on your left and a golf course on your left.
